KOTA KINABALU: Over 100 entrepreneurs from all over Sabah benefited from a seminar on "Transformasi Perniagaan Dengan E-Invois: Penetapan ke Dalam Strategi Pembangunan Lestari dan ESG". (Business Transformation with E-Invoice: Integration into Sustainable Development Strategies and ESG).

It was organised by the Sabah Women Entrepreneurs & Professionals Association (Swepa) and funded by Sabah Women's Affairs Department or Jabatan Hal Ehwal Wanita Sabah (Jhewa).
